



LA imported data details



Users now can look not just at numbers of pupils and LA who imported data, but which LA

Useful for establishing accuracy of regional and stat neighbour results, but also for Virtual Schools who may have children in education in those LA

Statistical Neighbour analysis

Added throughout Nova and Insight

Calculated at the pupil level so larger LA influence the SN results more than small LA (unlike LAIT which uses average of averages)



 - New SEN2 (EHCP only)
 - Closed SEN2 (EHCP only)

SEN2 – New Characteristics Section Charts






Your LA recorded 52 mediations for assessment requests, 79 for assessments and 15 for other reasons; other cases include mediation with respect to the content of the plan (click on 'i' next to the 'SEN2 Details' title for more information). Your SEN2 cohort has recorded 27 greater (lower) mediation meetings than the national rate for requests, 32 greater (lower) than the national rate for assessments and 17 greater (lower) than the national rate for other reasons.







A review of the SEN2 analysis has led to the update to analysis across the page where previously historical events were included in the analysis. The following data items will now only report on incidences within the reporting calendar year:

- Requests including outcomes and timeliness
- Assessments including counts, outcomes, refused and timeliness
- EHC plans including counts and timeliness for both with and without exceptions

All analysis for these data areas on the SEN2 Cohort page is now expected to reflect the same as the DfE analysis. Pupil Premium Update



- The Pupil Premium file will be appended with Spring Census data including:
 - FSM
 - PLAA (Previously adopted)
 - Service Premium
- Disadvantaged data will be updated by the Spring Census FSM and PLAA only.
- Service Premium data (e.g. Nova reports) will be updated by the Spring Census.
- The update is not year dependent but will only update if new January Census files are imported.



Updated Disadvantaged Methodology

Pupil Premium Update



DISADVANTAGED

81,692 of your LA's 186,848 pupils, that are considered for Pupil Premium, are classified as disadvantaged, this is 43.7% of your cohort.

This is 18.4% higher than the national average of 25.3%.

43.9% (39,969) of your female pupils are disadvantaged, 18.8% higher than the national of 25.1%. 43.6% (41,723) of your male pupils are disadvantaged, 18.1% higher than the national of 25.5%.


Disadvantaged pupils contribute £98,905,465 to the budget of your LA in disadvantaged funding.

This equates to an average of £241,232.84 per school in your LA.

Our current hosting environment at Rackspace has reached a point where both the infrastructure and service quality no longer meet the standards required for Nexus's continued growth and reliability. The hardware underpinning our platform is ageing, with servers running on extended-life Windows support, and our database servers are struggling with increased load, leading to performance bottlenecks. This creates risks to security, stability and performance, making transitioning to a modern, robust infrastructure imperative.

In addition to the technical challenges, Rackspace's customer service has declined significantly. Following their acquisition by a private equity firm several years ago, lead times for essential maintenance have grown, and mistakes during these processes have become more frequent. Furthermore, our dedicated account manager and technical lead at Rackspace have left and have not been replaced. This leaves us dependent on standard overseas support, which has reduced the speed and personalization of issue resolution.

Recognizing these challenges, we have chosen to migrate to a new provider that aligns with our strategic goals for 2025 and beyond. The migration will focus on ensuring a smooth transition to a modern, reliable infrastructure, but this process will temporarily shift some resources from our usual development and release cycles.



While the migration is underway, our project budget and release schedule will be impacted. To maintain the quality of the migration, we will reduce the number of releases during this period. However, the development team will continue working on new features and improvements. Once the new infrastructure is fully operational and stable, these updates will be thoroughly tested and queued for release later in the year.

Our new provider will offer:


- Industry-recognized certifications like ISO 27001, Cyber Essentials, and G-Cloud compliance
- UK-based hosting with dedicated UK support teams for faster, more responsive service
- Robust service-level agreements (SLAs)
- Comprehensive disaster recovery

This migration ensures that Nexus will operate on a modern, scalable infrastructure, enabling greater stability and unlocking opportunities for innovation. By prioritizing the quality of this transition, we are setting a solid foundation for growth and ensuring that our future releases are delivered on a platform built to last.



Nexus runs on .NET 4.8, a reliable platform with several years left in its support lifecycle. However, Microsoft has not provided a direct migration path to newer frameworks, and .NET 4.8's support timeline is tied to the end-of-life of its underlying operating system, which—while still several years out—remains inevitable. To future-proof our application, we plan to modernise incrementally. Our strategy begins with updating the user interface by transitioning to Vue.js, a flexible and efficient front-end framework. Vue.js will communicate with APIs, allowing us to streamline the application into a "thinner" web-based client. This phased approach makes the application lighter and more modular, setting the foundation for future migrations and technology upgrades without a complete overhaul. By updating the UI and APIs now, we position Nexus for easier transitions as new technologies and platforms emerge, ensuring stability, responsiveness, and scalability for our users.
